

SETH THOMAS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP
Given by the Family of Seth

The Seth Thomas Memorial Scholarship is an annual Scholarship dedicated to the Memory of the late Seth Thomas.

Seth was greatly influenced by agriculture; therefore a preference will be given to Individuals pursuing an education and career in agriculture. A complete list of guidelines is enclosed with an application. If extra copies of applications are needed they may be duplicated.

1. To be eligible, the applicant must be graduating from high school or enrolled in a college or trade school. The applicant must be a resident of Bates County.
2. The applicant must be in 4-H or FFA. First preference will be given to agriculture oriented applicants.
3. A great deal of emphasis will be weighed upon the applicant's honest, involvement, and their overall dedication to pursue their endeavor.
4. Consideration will be given to the applicant's community, civic, academic and actual need for financial assistance.
5. Each applicant will be required to provide three personal references that will submit letters of recommendation. The references need to be a high school teacher, and any other member of the community that is familiar with the applicant. The references may be sent with the application.
6. The scholarship committee reserves the right to conduct personal interviews in the event that more than two applicants score equally high on the application.
7. The scholarship will be given to two candidates that submit proof of their enrollment, furthermore they may reapply each year if they haven't previously won the scholarship
8. The deadline for all applications is June 1st. From these applications, one Scholarship of \$500.00 will be awarded at the Bates County Fair.

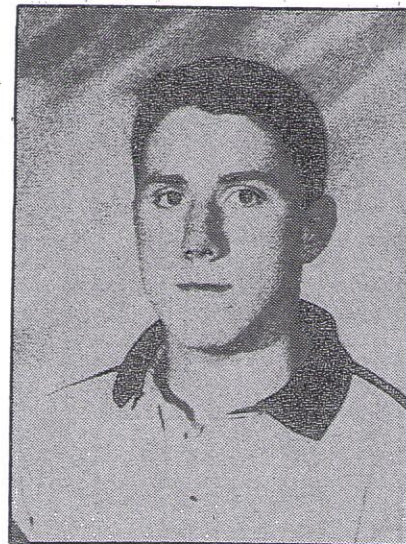

Seth, the older of two sons of Mitch and Shelly Thomas, was a freshman honor student at Ballard High School where he was involved in Science Olympiad, Pep Club, Quiz Bowl, basketball and baseball. His hobby was raising and showing cattle--an area in which he excelled, won many awards, and impressed both peers and adults with his knowledge. He worked as a cattleman and farmhand for Jack Baker, Don Radford and Al Jessup. He belonged to the Missouri Cattlemen's Association, North American Limousin Cattle Association and Ballard 4-H. His recent livestock credits include being on livestock judging teams in Missouri, Bates County, and Louisville, Kentucky...and winning Reserve Champion Limousin Steer at the 1995 Missouri State Fair, Grand Champion Limousin Heifer at the Bates County Fair, and Grand Champion Limousin Heifer at the Henry County Fair...plus Grand Champion Female of All Breeds and Senior Beef Showmanship all at the Henry County Fair.



Seth grew up fast and did a lot in 15 years...it was like he was born a man--he just naturally took care of everything!
