I am honored to be the Superintendent of this great school district and I am thankful for those of you who support and appreciated the efforts of all our staff.



A parent can check student attendance, current grades and lunch balances. If you have already been using this feature, your log-in information has not changed. If you need log-in information, just call the school and we'll give it to you.

We use the Facebook page to share reminders for upcoming events, announcements, fun things happening at school, etc. Click "Like" on the school's Facebook page to receive posts in your own news feed.






