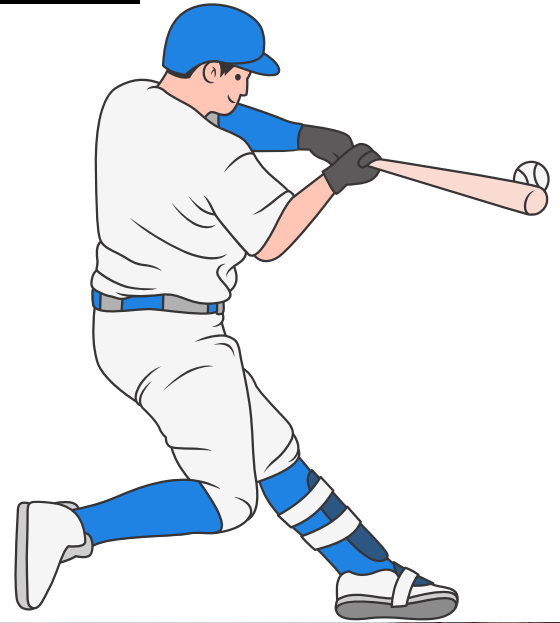

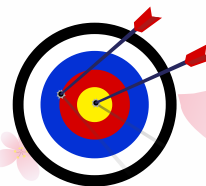

## Ballard FFA Celebrates State Success and Upcoming Opportunities

The Ballard FFA chapter has had a busy and successful season, achieving numerous goals and accomplishments. Most recently, members returned from the State FFA Convention with several honors. The Ballard FFA Knowledge Team earned a silver rating while competing against more than 60 teams from across the state. Team members included Aspyn Eidson, Emmalee Scott, Braydon Siebeneck, and Bentley Winter. Their success reflects the many hours of preparation and dedication they invested leading up to the competition. In addition, Ashton Siebeneck and Dayne Greer were both awarded the State FFA Degree, the highest honor an FFA member can receive at the state level. Greer also represented Area 7 and earned a state plaque for his Beef Placement Proficiency. FFA advisor Mrs. Trickey expressed pride in the chapter's hard work and dedication throughout the contest season, noting that the time and effort put in by members did not go unnoticed. Several teams and public speakers also qualified as alternates for state competitions. The chapter will host its annual FFA Banquet on Monday, May 11 at 6 p.m. in the school gym. The event will recognize members for their achievements and celebrate the year's successes. Looking ahead, Ballard FFA members are preparing for a busy summer. Two students, Emmalee Scott and Braydon Siebeneck, have been selected to attend the HYMAX Leadership Academy, which recognizes the top 100 freshmen in the state. Additionally, juniors Kennedy Borland and Ashton Siebeneck have been invited to attend the HYPE Leadership Academy, an honor reserved for the top 30 juniors statewide. Ballard FFA is also reaching out to younger students and families. Parents of students currently in grades 3–6 should watch for information about a three-day Ag Camp, scheduled for June 9–11 at the school. The camp will run for two hours each day, and participants will receive a free T-shirt while enjoying hands-on agricultural activities and learning experiences. With strong accomplishments behind them and exciting opportunities ahead, Ballard FFA continues to grow and make an impact in the community.
