The Ballard R-2 School District is pleased to be working in conjunction with the Adrian Optimist Club to honor a Student of the Month for the 2019-2020 school year.



February Questions:

Elementary (K-5th grade):



Middle School (6th – 8th grade):


You search through 100 clovers in one field and find 2 that are four-leafed, and then search in another field with 300 clovers and find 5 that are four-leafed. Based on this, what is the probable amount of four-leafed clovers you would find in a field with 50 clovers?

A Leprechaun offers to give you either his pot of gold or he will give you the amount of gold coins obtained following the pattern pictured below. Which do you choose?



Answer for January Edition:



For Joey to eat 2,020 hotdogs in one year, his rate per week is 2,020/52 because there are 52 weeks in a year. Simplifying this we get ≈ 38.84615385 hot dogs per week, so Joey must eat 39 hotdogs a week to reach his goal—this comes to 2,028 hotdogs, but if he only ate 38 a week it would be 1,976. To find per day and per hour, we follow the same process of finding how many days per year and how many hours per year. Per day: 2,020/365 ≈ 5.534246575 , or 6 hotdogs a day (which is actually 365(6) = 2,190. Per hour: 2,020/8760 ≈ 0.230593607 , or 1 hotdog per hour (which is actually 8,760(1) = 8,760).

Now the fun bit: If Joey Chestnut ate at his 74 hotdogs per 10 minute rate for the whole year, how many would he eat? First, 74 hotdogs per 10 minutes is 7.4 hotdogs per minute. There are 60 minutes per hour and 8,760 hours per year, so 525,600 minutes in a year. If he eats 7.4 hotdogs per minute we just need to multiply 7.4 times 525,600 minutes which is 3,889,440 hotdogs. That's almost 4 million hotdogs!






